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

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Chairperson Martin called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. The following agenda item was discussed:

### **1. Job Description – Career & Innovation Pathways Specialist**

Ms. Doherty asked Ms. Desmond to address the Subcommittee. Ms. Desmond spoke about the proposed job description and stated that it was written into a small grant to help manage and support the deliverables. Ms. Desmond asked LZ Nunn, Project Learn to address the Subcommittee regarding the proposed job description and Project Learn's partnership. Ms. Nunn stated that they applied for competitive funding from the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE) and they requested the maximum which was \$50,000. Through funding from Project Learn they were able to add up to an additional \$25,000 to support the position.

Ms. Doherty asked about it being a one (1) year grant.

Ms. Nunn stated that the grant ends in August.

Ms. Clark asked if there is a possibility to spend the grant money through August and then spend the Project Learn monies.

Ms. Nunn stated that the money ends from Project Learn in June 2020.

Ms. Desmond stated that is a very small grant with it only being \$50,000.

Ms. Clark stated that this sounds like a very important position and if successful we should look at possibly keeping this when budget time comes.

Ms. Doherty stated that she thinks there will be a need to continue this and we should have a plan in place to continue this with the contacts that have been established.

Ms. Martin stated that the person who used to do this should be included in this process. She stated that there is already someone at the high school that has these relationships with these companies.

Ms. Martin stated that the items that speak about assisting students should be removed in the posting as well that the position is temporary with no benefits and is not a full year.

Ms. Doherty stated that adjustments should be made to the grant.

**Ms. Doherty made a motion to accept and approve the job description with the changes made; seconded by Ms. Clark. 3 yeas APPROVED**



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Chairperson Doherty called the meeting to order at 5:38 p.m. The following agenda item was discussed:

### **1. Policy on Students Who Become Non-Residents of Lowell During the School Year**

Ms. Doherty asked Ms. Phillips to address the Subcommittee. Ms. Phillips spoke about the proposed policy and informed them that this policy will only be offered to high school seniors. The policy allows the Superintendent to make the final decision if the student is to remain enrolled at Lowell High School for the remainder of the school year if the student moves before the end of the school year. She also stated that the policy has been revised based on feedback she has received. The version online states that if the student has moved after the first marking period they may be allowed to remain enrolled and that language has been deleted and the new language is that a student starting at the beginning of the school year may be allowed to remain enrolled.

Ms. Martin asked if there is an impact on any sports participation etc. in terms of not being able to play on a sports team.

Mr. Dillion stated that if the school rules a student could play the MIAA generally adheres to the school rules and the student could live out of town.

Mr. Ortiz stated that he believed Mr. Dillon was correct that the MIAA would follow the district's decision similar to school choice (Chapter 75, section 5).

Mr. Dillon asked why the date was pushed back.

Ms. Phillips stated that it would be best to begin at the beginning of the school year as not to conflict with marking periods of other districts.


Mr. Doherty asked if we would still get the funds even if the student left.



Paraprofessionals	407	162 (40%)




This bar graph shows the distribution of respondents by grade level.



- Lack of a collaborative environment which includes staff and teachers decision-making







- I don't believe that alternative placement is right for most disruptive students. I would love to see support staff push IN and support them in the regular classroom. That way, they get the experience of the regular classroom without shutting it down every time there's a problem.
- Too many students are misplaced in the regular ed. classroom when they need to be in an adjustment class or mental health facility.











*There is too much focus and time committed to standardized testing in my school.*






# Conditions of Buildings



# In Their Own Words

Lowell as a city has lost the universal buy-in to education commitment between teacher student and parents. All 3 must be on the same page and we are far from as a whole city. Until that improves nothing will significantly

I love my students, I love my team, and I love teaching. Overly large classes and lack of support and resources makes it difficult to love my job. I feel like as a classroom teacher, I am given all of the responsibility but none of the power.

If I were able to decrease the number of students on my caseload, and decrease the workload that comes with it, I would better be able to service the students on my caseload who really NEED my professional expertise and consistent support

# In Their Own Words

The emotional workload of a teacher has exponentially increased since I began about 13 years ago. In the course of one school day we are behavioral specialists, social workers, nurses, psychologists, parents, custodians, differentiators of curriculum - and somewhere in the day between dodging a chair being kicked at us, drying the tears of multiple students, getting screamed at, pushed, kicked, bitten, or hit we must also find the time to teach.

We must find the time to inspire a love of learning, foster curiosity, and support every child in making at least a year worth of growth. The emotional toll is heavy and not a day goes by that I don't go home and feel the weight of it all. I wonder every day, what more could I have done today? How could I have better supported my students? I am grasping at straws trying to support the individual needs of every student. I love these children dearly and want the best for them. With every year that passes, I feel less able to provide that for them. It is soul crushing. This school year, we have not made it one day without tears, screaming, a tantrum, or other emotional outburst.

In response to the following motions we are providing the following information:

*[by Mayor John Leahy]: Request the Superintendent provide the committee with an update on Summer School Programs*

Preparation is well underway for 2020 summer programming. We are pleased to report that due to increased grants to the district we will be providing more summer learning opportunities for youth than in past years.

**IDEA Camp:** With support from the district and our partners Project Learn and UMASS Lowell, the 2020 IDEA Camp will once again be offered to our students in grades 5-10. Operating for 3 weeks from July 6-24th, IDEA Camp provides students with the opportunity to immerse more deeply into STEM topics such as: robotics, coding, architecture, underwater robots, and drones. Scholarships are available for LPS students at a reduced rate of \$40 per week.

The **21<sup>st</sup> Century Community Learning Center** grant will provide up to 1200 students with a 4 to 6 week program at the following schools:

Lowell High School (Freshman Academy)  
Butler Middle  
Sullivan Middle  
Stoklosa Middle  
Robinson Middle  
Shaughnessy Elementary

Morey Elementary  
Bartlett Community Partnership  
Lincoln Elementary  
Murkland Elementary  
McAvinnue Elementary  
McAuliffe Elementary

The district also has received an **After School and Out of School Time (ASOST)** grant for the Reilly and Pyne Arts Elementary. Both schools will run a 4 week summer program for their students (up to 300 slots).

The **Career Academy and Lowell High School** will be operating a 4 week summer program to assist students with credit recovery.

Lowell High School was awarded a **Gateway Cities English Learner Academies** grant to provide up to 100 newcomer and EL students with a 4 week, 6 hrs. per day program to support language acquisition.

**Early Childhood Program** The district has applied for funding to run a 6 week program for students in pre k and for students entering kindergarten with no prior school experience. This program was funded by DESE in FY20 and we are optimistic that the funding will continue this summer. The program will serve up to 60 students and will be housed at the Lincoln Elementary.

**Special Education Summer Programs** will provide up to 400 Lowell students with summer learning. The half day program will be held Monday –Thursday July 6-August 6<sup>th</sup>

Their request for same will be given to their immediate supervisor who will compile all of the requests for his department or school and forward them intact to the Superintendent. The Superintendent will compute the total cost of all requests and present the total request to the Committee no later than January the fifteenth for its consideration.*


