1. Ratification of the following application from October 5, 2021:
Application by Samuel Moko for a “Special One Day License to sell/dispense Malt Beverages and Wines Only,” for a ‘Wake Keeping Celebration,’ to be held at the Hellenic Center, 62 Lewis Street on October 16th, 2021 from 6:00 PM to Midnight.
2. Public hearing on the application by Number Two China Star LLC, Johnny Le, proposed Manager, for a ‘change of license manager’ for their “all alcoholic beverages restaurant license,” for premises at 44 Palmer Street.
3. Communication from Raymond Kelly Richardson, Superintendent of Police, dated October 12, 2021, regarding allegations of misconduct charged against The Middle Street Village, d/b/a The Village Smokehouse, 92-98 Middle Street, Alan Kaplan, License Manager, all alcoholic beverages restaurant licensee.
