City of Lowell to Begin Mobile COVID-19 Vaccination Clinics, Announces Centralville Clinic

LOWELL, MA – In an effort to further promote equity in the distribution of COVID-19 vaccinations, the City of Lowell is launching a new strategy to administer shots to residents through pop-up mobile clinics at neighborhood sites throughout the City.

The City's first mobile clinic will take place on Monday, April 12 from 8:00 AM through 6:00 PM at the Robinson Middle School, located at 110 June Street. 500 doses of Johnson & Johnson's single-shot COVID-19 vaccine will be administered at the clinic. Residents seeking a vaccination at the mobile site must make an appointment in advance.

The City is conducting outreach to encourage Centralville residents to take advantage of the opportunity of receive the vaccine in their neighborhood, however all Lowell residents who meet current eligibility guidelines can make an appointment for the clinic. Appointments can be reserved online at: lowellma.gov/mobilevax, or by phone at: 978-228-3019.

"The City is working tirelessly to support the timely, efficient, and equitable distribution of COVID-19 vaccinations to our resident." said **City Manager Eileen Donoghue**. "The addition of mobile clinics will significantly enhance access to COVID-19 vaccinations in the City and will provide us with a valuable tool to reach residents who may have difficulty traveling to sites outside of their immediate neighborhood. We encourage eligible residents to take advantage of these convenient opportunities to protect themselves and the community by getting vaccinated."

The mobile clinic will be operated under the direction of the Lowell Health Department by A Yankee Line, Inc. and Purple Shield Alert, which are partnering to run mobile vaccination units throughout the Commonwealth under a contract with the Department of Public Health.

The City of Lowell intends to host mobile clinics weekly at sites throughout the City going forward. Residents are advised to remain alert to announcements of mobile clinics in their neighborhood in the coming weeks.

Residents seeking a vaccination should [verify their eligibility](#) prior to registering for an appointment. Those currently eligible to receive the COVID-19 under to the state's three-phase distribution timeline include: individuals age 55 and older, individuals with one or more certain medical condition, first responders, healthcare workers, congregate care residents and staff, health conditions, low income and senior housing residents and staff, K-12 teachers and school staff, childcare providers, and certain essential workers.
